

LPCO Outreach Director Position Description

Overview

The Outreach Director shall be responsible for booking and running outreach booths and community events, and for maintaining outreach materials.

The Outreach Director also serves as one of the eleven members of the State Board.

Key Responsibilities

- Maintain a calendar of events where the LPCO can have a booth or participate. Such events may include county fairs, parades, gun shows, political rallies, etc.
- Schedule and register LPCO to be a participant at events.
- Coordinate volunteers to staff the LPCO booth or participate at events.
- Work with the Affiliates Director and Membership Director regarding activities that develop and grow the party.
- Attend LPCO Board meetings and participate in discussions and decision-making. Board meetings are currently held during the evening on the second Monday of each month.
- Provide a short director report each month, prior to the LPCO board meeting.

Qualifications

- Must be a sustaining member of the LPCO. To be a sustaining member you must be registered as a Libertarian in Colorado and either be a lifetime member of the National Party or have paid annual dues of \$25.00 to the Libertarian Party of Colorado.
- Agree to sign the Statement of Principles of the National Libertarian Party and a statement disavowing the initiation of force to achieve political or social goals.
- Strong communication and organizational skills.
- Commitment to the principles and mission of the Libertarian Party.

Term & Election

- The Outreach Director is a 2-year term and is elected at the LPCO State Convention in even-numbered years.
- The Outreach Director may be re-elected for consecutive terms.

Impact

The Outreach Director provide opportunities for people to interact with the Party, learn about Libertarian values, and possibly become a member.
