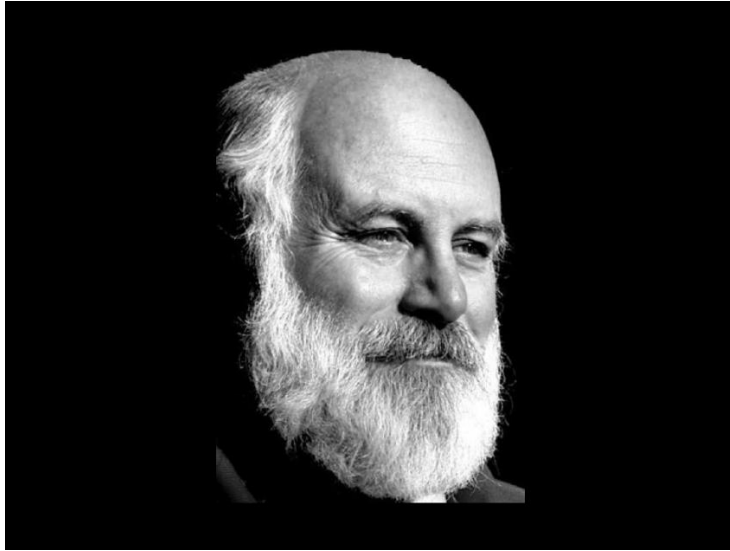


Blake Huber for U.S. Senate



Blake Huber is a longtime political activist and advocate for election reform. He has been involved in political campaigns since the age of 17, with a lifelong interest in ethics and the structure of democratic systems.

Huber spent more than 30 years in management, overseeing large apartment communities, a small business, a motel, and teams of network engineers. His professional background informs his practical, results focused approach to public policy.

Huber first became involved with the Libertarian Party after hearing Roger MacBride, the second Libertarian Party presidential candidate, speak on a Kansas City radio station, a moment that helped him realize he wasn't alone, he was a libertarian. He later served as a state chair of the Libertarian Party and as a member of its national committee. While he now focuses on election reform, he has consistently encouraged voters to support Libertarian candidates and remains committed to expanding voter choice.

His interest in voting reform was shaped by the presidential campaigns of Ross Perot and Ralph Nader, which highlighted for him the limitations of single choice voting. Today, Huber advocates for approval voting, which he also calls satisfaction voting, a system that allows voters to support more than one candidate and aims to produce outcomes that better reflect voter preferences.

Huber has run on the Approval Voting Party ticket for Vice President of the United States in 2016, Colorado Secretary of State in 2018, and for President of the United States in 2020 and 2024.

Key Issues

1. Better voting methods to find real middle ground.
2. Rational immigration reform that makes it easier for good people to contribute.
3. Regulation reform that reduces unnecessary burdens on small businesses.
