## Media Interviews

Interviews with the Denver Post, Colorado Times Recorder, and Complete Colorado.
Live on the air - Jeff and Bill Radio Show and the Ross Kaminsky Radio Show.
Updated media contacts (TV, radio and newspaper) in CiviCRM. The number of emails was increased from approximately 20 to 98, which increased the number of media outlets from approximately 25 to 140.

## Other Activities and Issues

Attended meetings with the Alliance for Competitive Elections (ACE) and other Colorado minor political party leaders.
Created LPCO Candidate Records (1972 to 2024) for partisan races. Purpose: 1) Provide goals for serious candidates. 2) Provide realistic expectations for first-time candidates. 3) Recognize our top candidates.
Helped Joe Johnson, our Campaigns Director, with recruiting 2026 candidates. Helped candidates with their biographies. Posted candidate bios, issues and photo the website.
Completed the 2026 Candidate’s Handbook for Libertarians running for office in Colorado.
Attended the annual El Paso County Convention.
The number of LPCO sustaining members has grown 15% since the 2025 State Convention in October.

## 2026 Goals

Continue to help and provide support to our 2026 candidates for public office. Provide a candidate training session in the coming months.
Continue to increase the number of LPCO Sustaining Members. The number of LPCO sustaining members has grown 16% since the 2025 State Convention in October.
Increase the number of registered Libertarians. During the past several years the number of registered Libertarians in Colorado has decreased 15% or about 7,000 voters. Since the October state convention, the number of registered Libertarians has held relatively constant, even with voters changing their registration to vote in the 2026 Primary Election. We expect to see more Libertarians switching their voter registration to Unaffiliated before June 8 <sup>th</sup> so they can vote in the Primary Election. After the Primary Election we expect to see a gain in Libertarian voters which typically happens during an election year as our candidates are out campaigning and exciting voters.
